The Florida Region will not link to Area websites that publish or link to unauthorized copyrighted materials. Areas are encouraged to use the Fellowship Approved disclaimer, "Narcotics Anonymous is not affiliated with these organizations, nor do we recommend one program over another. We simply provide this information in a spirit of cooperation" (IP#27), for any references not specified above. Sites that do not meet this requirement will be immediately removed and notified to comply with the Florida Regional Guidelines. The RSC group conscience may remove links to an Area website that it determines does not present a "clear NA message."

Intent:

To follow: Our 12th Concept which states, "In keeping with the spiritual nature of Narcotics Anonymous, our structure should always be one of service, never of government," and Our 2nd Tradition, which states, "For our group purpose, there is but one ultimate authority, a loving God as He may express Himself in our group conscience. Our leaders are but trusted servants, they do not govern," and Our 4th Tradition, which states, "Each group should be autonomous except in matters affecting other groups or NA as a whole," and Our 6th Tradition, which states that "An NA group ought never endorse, finance, or lend the NA name to any related facility or outside enterprise, lest problems of money, property, or prestige divert us from our primary purpose." Member areas of the Florida Region should not be indirectly **required** to adhere to Florida Regional guidelines. Areas should be able to develop a group conscience without intervention from the Florida Region. The Florida Region reserves the right to distance itself from an Area that the RSC believes is negatively "affecting other groups or NA as a whole."

Bahamas Bermuda outreach –I Proposal –To revise two line items in the Admin Budget to read Bahamas Workshop Travel and Bermuda Workshop Travel. The amount of \$3600 for each line item is to remain as is.

Rationale – Because of the difficulty of travel to the US for these two areas and the difficulty in finding trusted servants willing to travel to the US for six Regional Service conferences another way is being sought to carry the message of service and NA news and events to these two Island nations that belong to the Florida Region. The Bermuda Area has also just recently requested that the Florida Region come to their Area to conduct workshops specifically on Service as well as presentations regarding the current Service Structure and the proposed service System. The Bahamas Area has requested this of us several times since 2006. Sending a delegation of two trusted servants well versed in Service and with an ability and a willingness to not only travel freely outside the United States but to also spend two full days conducting presentations and workshops to the local fellowship has the potential of reaching many more addicts directly than when one individual attends a Regional Service conference sporadically. A new level of enthusiasm could be stimulated in the local fellowships of these two areas and entice more members back to participating in order to build a stronger network of recovering people on the islands. The Florida Region and the Bahamas Area experienced just these results after we brought a Regional Service conference to the Bahamas in 2006. While the enthusiasm lasted several months and it appeared that this could be sustained, what resulted was a gradual slide back into the complacency that was felt prior to our RSC in that Area. A sustained effort on the part of the Florida Region along with continued participation from each of these two local fellowships may assist in building stronger home groups, keeping long time members involved in order to mentor newer members to carry on in service on these islands, educate the professional community further about Narcotics Anonymous, give local addicts a safe haven and a viable choice for recovery. Small isolated (geographically) fellowships experience challenges that we may not experience and may require special effort and support in order to sustain a strong fellowship. Financial and Spiritual Impact – currently there is \$3600 per Area per budget year for each Area to send a representative to our Regional Service Conference. The reality is that travel is not always possible for these two areas when the RSC meets. The

workgroup's research also found that it was generally (almost unanimously) agreed that one person receiving information and then disseminating that information would not be as impactful as two people disseminating information to a larger number of people directly. Visual Aids would further enhance that message. New faces and new voices also have a stimulating affect on people who may have been hearing the same voice and the seeing the same faces many times. Since currently there would be no budget change but the potential for reaching more addicts increases exponentially the financial impact to the Region as a whole and to the Bahamas and Bermuda Areas specifically is extremely positive and long lasting. The workgroup discussed suggested, specific qualifications which are the following: | Ability to travel outside the US legally (Valid Passport, no outstanding warrants here or abroad) | Integrity behind reproach | At least five years experience conducting NA workshops including roundtable discussions and interactive presentations | Ability and willingness to conduct two full days of NA workshops with full availability to the local workshops while on the islands | Complete familiarity with Service System Proposals, complete familiarity with current Service System in the Florida Region, consensus Based decision making , knowledge of Service Based NA Literature and material and ability to conduct or present the material to addicts who have never heard it before | Excellent listening skills and ability to respond to questions about most service based subject matter. Good verbal presentation skills | Knowledge, understanding, and application of twelve steps, twelve traditions, and twelve concepts.

Guidelines for Behind the Walls

Purpose: The purpose is to establish a written set of Guidelines so all participating members can adhere in a uniform way on how to conduct themselves in accordance with the guiding principles of Narcotic Anonymous. While maintaining an effective working relationship with all that we serve while participating in Behind the Walls meetings. This is to further our purpose of bringing NA meetings into Florida State Correctional Facilities.

Guidelines:

1. Refrain from using abusive or profane language at any BTW meeting.
2. Respect all confidentiality, anonymity of inmates and outside members.
3. Refrain from participating in any favoritism with incarcerated members, no special favors.
4. Refrain from making any contact with family members or friends of inmates outside the facility.
5. Attest to not having been a victim or accomplice with any incarcerated member.
6. Practice common courtesy at all times when interacting with the facility staff and when participating in the BTW meetings.
7. Dress appropriately as indicated in DOC Orientation.
8. Notify the liaison of any misbehavior from inmates. Contact the H&I Resource Coordinator so he or she can address the issue with the facility's staff.
9. Read H&I's "Do and Dont's" and practice common sense at all times.

10. Read and share NA approved literature only.

11. Restrictions including only men attend men's meetings and only women are to attend women's meetings.

The liaison between the NA Fellowship and each facility will provide a monthly report to the H&I Coordinator and the Fellowship Development Group of the Florida Region of Narcotics Anonymous. Florida Region of NA - Sponsorship Behind the Walls Correspondence Guidelines. We are a "NA SPONSORSHIP" project, operating under the Fellowship Development Group of the Florida Region of Narcotics Anonymous. This may well be one of the most rewarding things you do for your recovery. The primary purpose of this project is to provide Sponsorship, through the mail, for inmates who desire to work the Twelve Steps of Narcotics Anonymous. • It is our purpose to provide Sponsors who are willing to correspond with any inmate who has the desire to work the Steps. It is our hope, that in our correspondence, we will help the suffering addict find the solution that we have found. Our primary purpose is, just for today to stay clean and carry the message of recovery to the still sick and suffering addict. In observance of the of the Correctional Facilities rules regarding mail and correspondence, the following is suggested guidelines from shared experience, to help you when writing NA members on the "Inside":

1. Potential Sponsors must have at least one year clean and be actively participating in the NA Fellowship with a Sponsor.

2. In keeping with Tradition Twelve, we respect the anonymity of our correspondents. All correspondence will be sent through a Post Office Box, with a correspondence coordinator forwarding mail to other members, who are participating in the "NA Sponsorship Behind the

Walls” program. No personal contact either in person or by phone is permitted. All correspondence should be received through the Florida Regional Service Office. Never give out your address or phone number. For your own protection and anonymity, it is suggested that you use your first name only or a pen pal name, if you choose.

3. When we engage in this type of service, it should always be men writing to men and women writing to women. Please refer to the following Narcotics Anonymous recovery and service literature that strongly support this suggestion. H&I Service Bulletin #5 Men working with Men, Women working with Women; Hospitals & Institutions Handbook Page 7; IP #11 Sponsorship Revised and the PR Handbook Page 112. Never write anything you don't want the world to read. All correspondence is opened and subject to monitoring by the institution.

4. Correctional Facilities have rules for sending literature. Most Correctional Facilities only allow inmates to receive literature directly from the publisher, you should always check with a facility before mailing books or literature. Photocopies of literature (no staples) included in your correspondence is usually accepted by the institution. Most facilities do not allow inmates to receive stamps or preaddressed stamped envelopes.

5. If an inmate requests an NA book or booklet from you, the Fellowship Development Group of the Florida Region of Narcotics Anonymous will send an Introductory Guide to Narcotics Anonymous to the inmate, upon your request.

6. NA members who are writing and/or Sponsoring an inmate should not visit that facility unless approved by the facility.

7. Remember, it only takes two addicts to have a meeting and writing is no different. Let the inmate know, that all forms of sharing whether in a meeting and/or writing, helps us as much as it helps them. Remind the inmate that they are never alone. We simply share our experience, strength, hope and being clean in recovery. Change happens as a result of working/applying the principles behind the 12 steps of recovery we encourage you to be a step-writing guide through that process.

8. Encourage the inmate to participate in twelve step meetings available to them within the facility.

9. Prior to their release, we strongly suggest sending them an area/regional meeting schedule in the vicinity where they will be released. It is important to have a “game plan” and general knowledge of meeting places the first day they are released. Sponsors should encourage the inmate's participation in the Bridging the Gap/Bridge Project upon their release. Thank you for taking part in your own recovery by sharing and caring the NA way so that “No addict seeking recovery need ever die.”

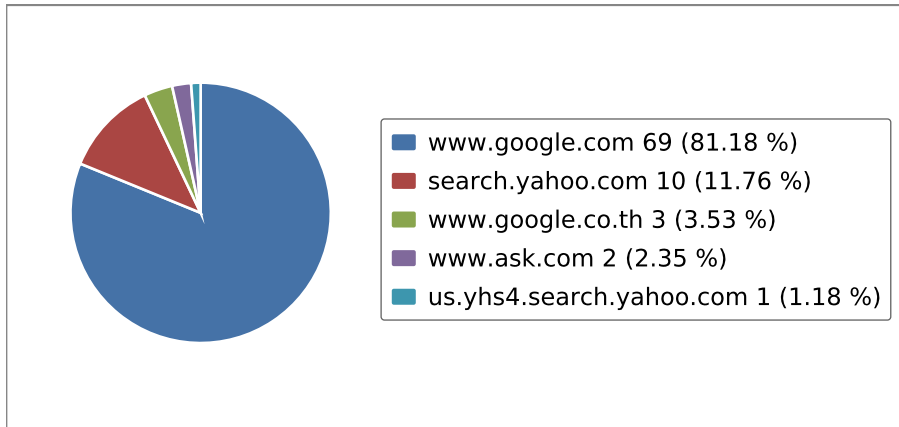

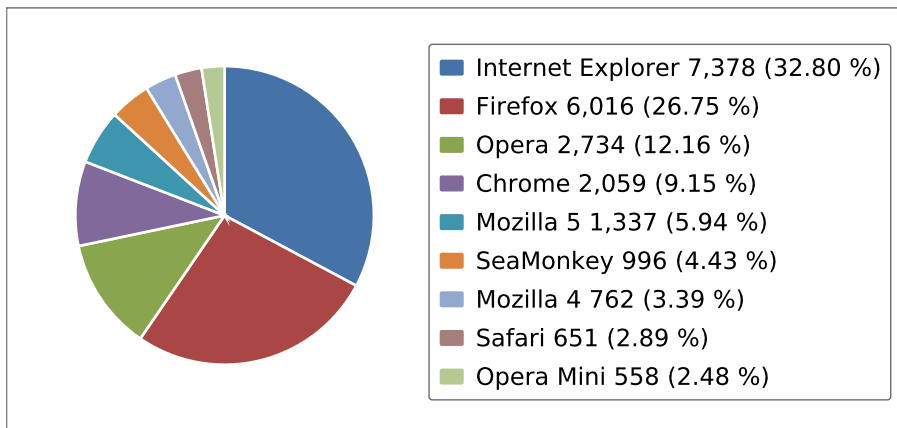

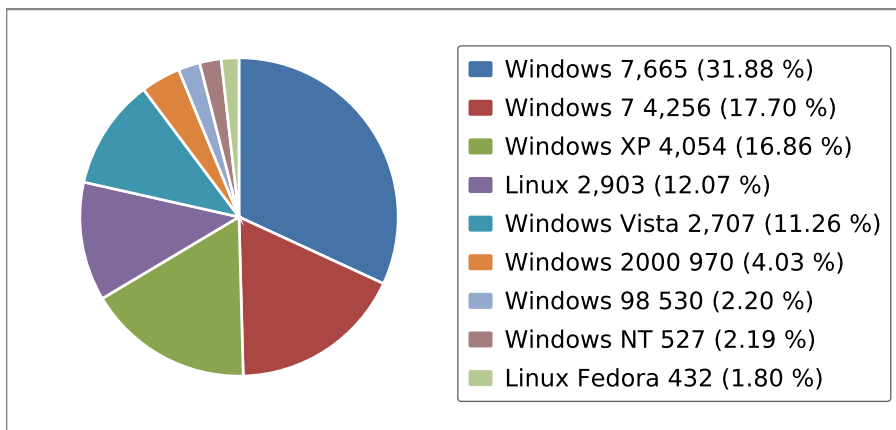
